### **No Short Cuts Please!**

There have been several incidences where staff are being called downtown for an investigation with QA for NOT following procedures. It is not your problem if there's a problem with the set up prior to your arrival for work that will cause the blood drive to start late. Computer issues are not your problem.

Please, **do not take shortcuts** to get the drive started on time, **that problem belongs to management** not you. You never know who is watching you. Follow proper procedures.

When you think that you are helping the manager to start his drive on time and you have taken a short cut to get it done on time he or she calls up and reports you to processing support, then you are pulled from task and an investigation has already begun before you get downtown to talk with QA. FOLLOW PROCEDURE.

Trust me, you don't want to have to get caught up in an investigation with QA.

It's not a good thing when you get called in. Never go in to a meeting without a Union representative. Remember your job is your livelihood.

Sometimes people think that their coworkers will throw them under the bus, but in most cases, it's that person you are trying to help get their drive started on time (your manager) who has called and reported you for BREAKING PROCEDURE.

Just do it the right way and you will not have any problems. And always make sure you get in touch with me or a Union rep if you do get called in.

#### CONTRACT CORNER

Hello Brothers & Sisters of 5103,

As you may or may not know, with the ratification of the National Addendum, there was a change regarding the application of the belt line premium. Prior, donors centers were not eligible for the premium, but as October 1, 2018 they are. Following is the excerpt from the National Addendum - Article 10, Section 5 (c)(2) (a,b) - regarding belt line for fixed sites:

- (2) For Fixes Sites, a late end will occur if the Phlebotomy End Time (as reflected by the actual time stamp) exceeds the Last Appt End Target. Below is the logic supporting the late end definition:
- A. Identify the last appointment slot at each drive by procedure type
  - 1. Apheresis
  - 2. Double Red
  - 3. Whole Blood
  - 4. AB Plasma
- B. Add the appropriate duration minutes per procedure to arrive at expected Appt end time
  - 1. Apheresis = 180
  - 2. Double Red = 75
  - 3. Whole Blood = 45
  - 4. AB Plasma = 80

Basically, if you are working Whole Blood at a fixed site and the last whole blood appointment slot is 7:00, you receive the belt line premium if the donor is still actively donating at 7:46. Similarly, if your last Apheresis appointment is 4:30 and the donor is still on the bed at 7:31, you will receive the premium. The same concept applies for Double Red (add 75 minutes) and AB Plasma (add 80 minutes) procedures. I hope this helps to clear up any confusion and as always, if you have any questions, please don't hesitate to contact me or another Rep/Board Member!
